AN t-SAMHAIN (no "Cuimhneachadh")

'S eadh, 's i **mìos a' chuimhneachaidh** a th'anns **an t-Samhain**.

Mar a chuireas òran air leth 'nar cuimhne, stad "*ràn nan gunnan mór*" o chionn fhada, ach air dòigh air chor-eigin – agus ann an saoghal is dualchas nan Gàidheal gu h-àraidh – tha **ciallachadh is ath-fhuaimneachadh** anns an dà Chogadh Mhór a mhaireas gu ruig' an latha an-diugh. Gu nàdurach, dh'fhuiling gach uile coimhearsnachd a ghabh pàirt ann an strithean móra an 20mh linn a cuid chall, ach ann an coimhearsnachd a tha na's lugha, faodaidh gu'm bheil coltas a's géire, a's fhaisg' air làimh air na cail seo fhathast. Fiù 's an latha an-diugh, mar eiseamplair, tha e duilich na cùntasan a leughadh air an oidhche uabhasaich a bha siud - **Oidhche Challainn 1918** - 'nuair a chaidh an *Iolaire* agus i a' toirt 283 daoine 'dhachaigh do na h-Eileanan an deaghaidh an Fhosaidh fodha ach

Well, friends, at the end of October the clocks go back and suddenly it seems as if the days are getting shorter and shorter. Farewell to the final, fading warmth of autumn and everything that is connected with it! At this time of year our thoughts inevitably turn to the remainder of year ahead of us and yet, at the same time, to the past and sometimes to the very distant past. Yes, **November** is the **month of remembrance**.

As a certain song reminds us, the "*roar of the big guns*" stopped a long time ago, but somehow – and in Gaelic life and culture in particular – the two World Wars have **a significance and a resonance** that endures to the present day. Naturally, every community that took part in the great conflicts of the 20th century suffered its losses, but in a smaller community, these losses can still seem to be more immediate and more acute. Even today, for example, it's difficult to read the accounts of that dreadful night – **New Year's Eve 1918** – when the *Iolaire* bringing 283 men home to the Islands after the Armistice sank just a mile off Stornoway harbour: bitter the irony that they survived the trenches and the battlefields, but that over 200 of them perished in the waters only a few yards from the

Ged a chaidh còrr is 90 bliadhna seachad o chionn deireadh a' chiad chogaidh agus 60 bliadhna o chionn an dàrna fhir, is annasach a' chéilidh no an cruinneachadh far nach cluinnear òrain mar *An Eala Bhàn*, *Tuireadh nan Treun*, *Deireadh Leave 1940* no *Gleann Bhaile Chaoil* is m.s.a.a., agus gach fear dhiùbh 'na chomh-thabhartas fhéin do **thuigsinn is shealladh nan Gàidheal** air na còmhragan a bha siud.

shore (and safety) of home. They lost their lives, and we live with the knowledge of the effect that this had on the Islands with the loss of almost an entire generation and the unanswerable question "*What if ..?*".

In other ways, as Gaels we carry within ourselves a **collective memory** that expresses itself through our inheritance – oral tradition, poetry and song. Even though more than 90 years have passed since the end of the first war and 60 years since the second, rare is the céilidh or gathering where songs such as *An Eala Bhàn* (The White Swan), *Tuireadh nan Treun* (Lament for the Brave), *Deireadh Leave 1940* (End of Leave 1940) or *Gleann Bhaile Chaoil* (The Glen of Ballachulish) etc. will not be heard, each one being its own contribution to the **Gaelic understanding of and perspective** on those conflicts.

Here in London, if we wish to pay our respects to the fallen, we can go on and look up at the various memorials scattered all over the city and see the names of regiments and individuals – Highland, Scottish, British and others. Or perhaps we can go to places such as the **Imperial War Museum** and, among the displays, try to catch a glimpse and a better understanding of what those who made the sacrifice went through in time of war.

Well, as Gaels, it's not in our nature to blow our own trumpet – of course – but I couldn't let the occasion pass without mentioning the success that **Còisir Lunnainn** – The London Gaelic Choir – enjoyed at this year's **Royal National Mòd in Oban**. The "London Gaels" came third in the Lovat and Tullibardine Competition - the main prize for choirs – just behind Dingwall Gaelic Choir (1st) and Glasgow Gaelic Musical Association (2nd).

A few words about the Choir:

Did you know that the **world's oldest Gaelic choir** didn't start in the Highlands, but here in London? Well, it did, and **Còisir Lunnainn** was founded in **1891** (one year before the Mòd itself!) and, except in the two World Wars, has been continuing ever since. In spite of its "age", the Choir is a modern institution as well, with its own **website** and **e-mail address** (*see below*)! So, if you're interested in Gaelic music and song, why not pay the Choir a visit? **Visitors and new members are always warmly welcome.**
